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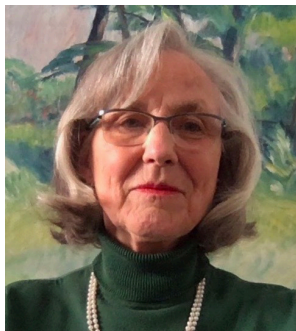

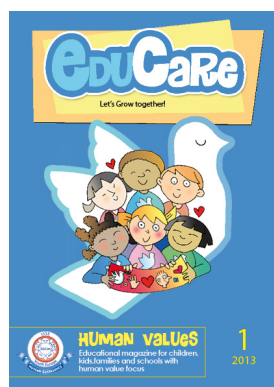

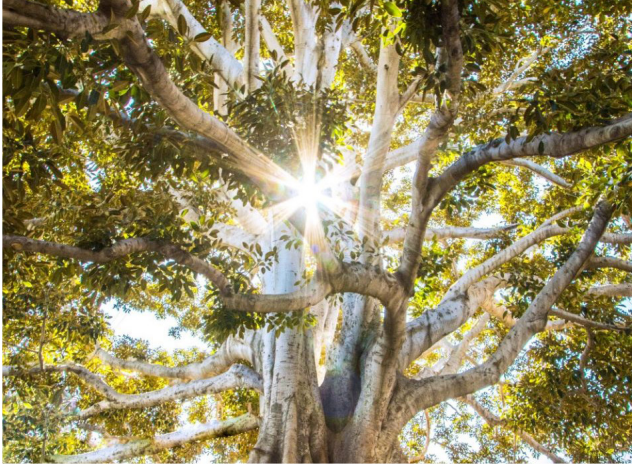


EduCare Magazines

A PROJECT FOR EVERYONE

This unprecedented programme for public school teachers designed to uplift **civic education with value focus**, and approved by the Italian Ministry of Education, is ongoing. Its overall concept is linked to the area of education concerned with sustainable development and is being carried out by the Italian team of the Institute of Sathya Sai Education of South Europe (ISSE SE). The first module of the Training Programme "Education in Human Values - a Path for Life", highlighted by the acrostic "P.A.C.E.: *Pensieri in Armonia, Comportamento in Equilibrio*" (**PEACE: Thoughts in Harmony, Behaviour in Balance**), was held online from October 2021 to June 2022. The programme will continue throughout 2023 with modules 2 and 3.

On August 26, 2022, at a Special Session in the nation's capital, the **Federal Senate of Brazil**, the Upper House of the National Congress, honoured the contribution of the Institute of Sathya Sai Education of Brazil for its tireless work over 22 years in developing value-based education in the country. The first Sathya Sai School was established in Brazil in 1993. There are now three schools in three different regions which offer education to underprivileged children. Food and other basic necessities are also provided to their families.

An Effective Approach to Grow Together

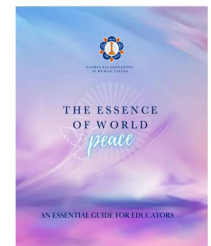
The **Australian Sathya Sai Colleges** (in Murwillumbah & Dunbay, NSW) have adopted an effective approach to professional development in both the primary and secondary campuses that ensures teachers in-depth understanding of the Human Values and promotes their own growth. Fortnightly staff meetings explore the value aspect for the following fortnight. In turn, teachers prepare activities for the chosen value and lead the staff through these. Together, they do silent sitting, sing songs and work through group activities as if they were the students, followed by a brainstorming session to improve, add suggestions and share ideas about how to extend the value into all curriculum subjects and the whole-school environment. The approach encourages the use of the “6Es” to facilitate the growth of the values inherent within teachers and students: **Engage** students in the topic through questioning; **Explain** the values and their place in life; **Explore** the topic from different perspectives; **Elaborate** and apply to daily life; **Evaluate** the impacts of the values on students’ daily lives; and **Excel** – take ownership of the values through thought-provoking take-home messages or examples. Through this process, the students benefit from the richness of this communal planning and the teachers come away from the meetings with an enriched understanding of the values and their application to their own lives.



Like all toddlers Tom likes to get his hands on everything. His parents put the breakables on higher shelves and lock the family library. But one day the child finds the door open... The room is replete with books. Long scrolls of paper seem to be peeking down at him from the highest shelves. Oh, how Tom would like to play with them! Just then, a gust of wind opens the library window, and a cool breeze enters the room. The scrolls tip over and fall onto the floor. The boy picks up the biggest one and unrolls it. He doesn't know the worth and beauty of the antique world map he is holding in his hands. It is a work of art, an undatable masterpiece. He crumbles and tears the map into pieces and is having a bundle of fun when his dad walks in the room. “Oh Tom!”, cries his father aghast. The floor is covered with torn paper. “Playing with the world you have torn it to pieces!”. He said. “Now how will we put it back together?” Father and son try to match the pieces of what is now a gigantic puzzle. But the design is too intricate, it is impossible to reassemble. Then a new breeze flips a few pieces over. “An eye!”, cries Tom. The boy's father makes his guess and turns all the pieces over. Even a small boy can identify them. “A nose... a mouth... an ear...”. Father and son find a sense to the puzzle: it is the image of a human being. They tape the pieces together and flip the image around. The world is in one piece again. No more “pieces but Peace”.
